Executive summary

Executive Summary

As a result of the Health Watch report, 2018, looking at services across Norfolk that provide both pre and post diagnostic support for those on the Autism Spectrum and those that care for them, they noticed a distinct lack of support for those who are currently waiting for or have just received a diagnosis of Autism Spectrum Disorder.

We at ASD Helping Hands formulated a four-week parent and carer workshop that covers the four main concerns raised by parents and carers;

- What is autism?
- Understanding and managing behavior.
- Sensory integration
- Aiding in communication

In June/July 2019 we ran our first full workshop, this was intended by 12 individuals all parent of children with autism or waiting for an assessment. This report will outline the course, feedback to gained from the course and our future plans to roll out the workshop across the whole of Norfolk.



Course outline

Week 1: Understanding Autism

This week will cover:

- Triad of impairment
- The autism spectrum
- Co-morbid conditions and mental health

Week 1 focuses on introducing the cohort to the world of autism, outlining the key difficulties in those with autism as well as exploring some of the other conditions that are associated with the spectrum disorders.

week 2: understanding behaviour

- The anger mountain
- The brain
- Understanding how parenting can affect behaviour
- How to support during a meltdown
- ABC charts and monitoring behaviour

Week 2 looks at the biological reasons for behaviour and how parents/carers can support and deescalate these situations.

Week 3 the sensory world

This week will cover:

- The seven senses
- Hyperactive vs hypoactive
- Arousal states
- Supporting sensory difficulties

Week 3 introduces the group to the idea of sensory integration and difficulties. During this week we allow the participants to experience sensory overload using our own original exercise and we also discuss the best ways to support sensory integration within the home environment.

Week 4-communication

This week we will cover:

- Difficulties with communication
- Visual aids
- Supporting the development of social skills

Week 4 concentrates on the specific difficulties in relation to communication and autism. We introduce and discuss various communication aids and the best way to implement these at home and the community.


Learning aids used

- Physical activity
- Homework tasks

We plan on rolling out this course across six areas within Norfolk, running one course each half term.

These six areas and provisional dates are:

- Dereham- September 19
- Norwich – November 19
- Kings Lynn- January 2020
- Great Yarmouth and Waveney- April 2020
- Aylsham – June 2020
- Thetford- March 2020

We hope that this will then become a rolling course ran each year in the above locations and go towards a pre and post diagnostic support package alongside our family support service to ensure that families and carers affected by ASD receive they need, when they need it, and prevent situations escalating and requiring the interventions of statutory organisations such as mental health teams and social services and children services.
